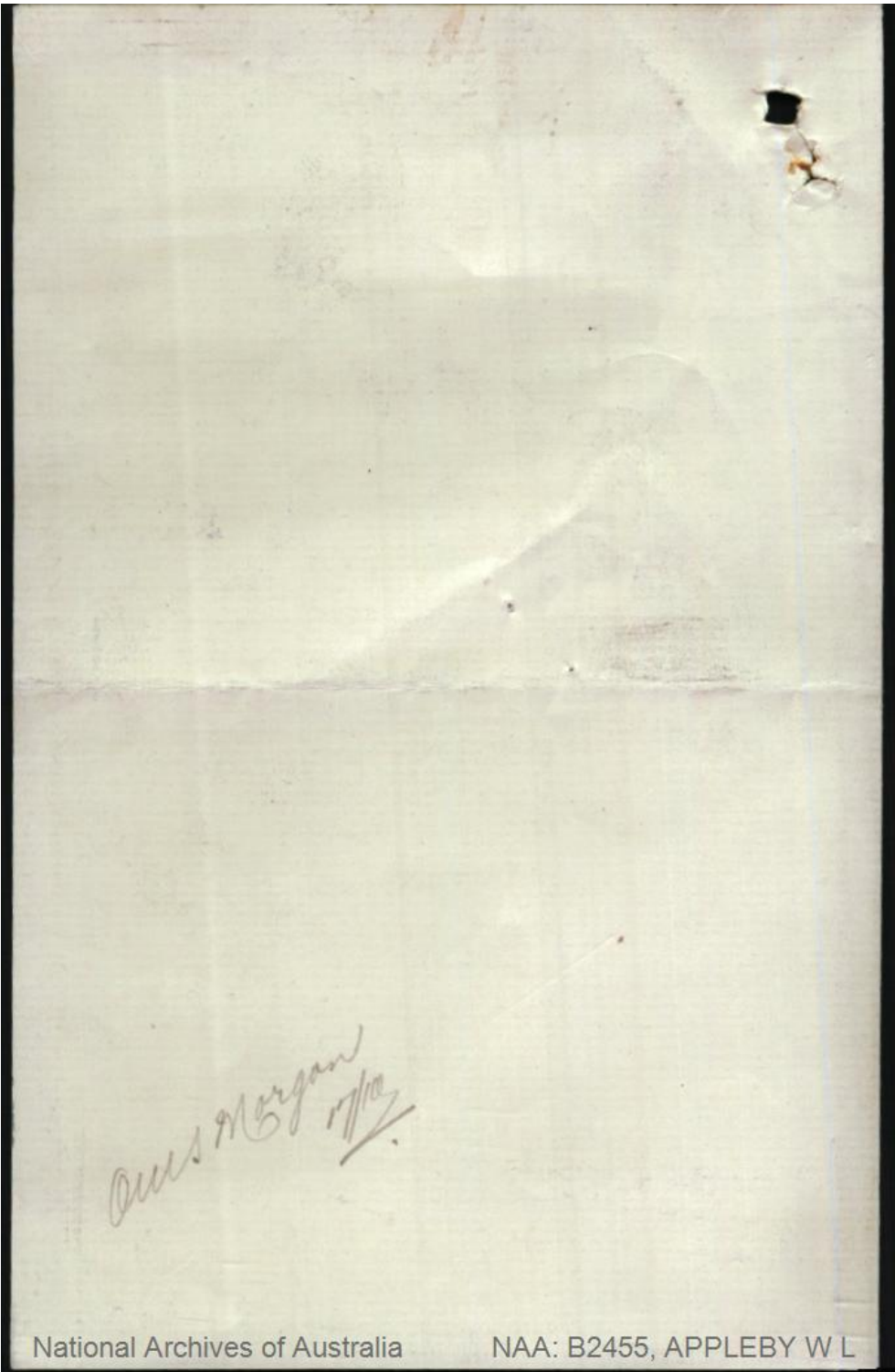

With further reference to the report of the regrettable loss of your son, the late Capt. W.L. Appleby, 18th Battalion, I am now informed by the Imperial War Graves Commission that the remains of the late officer were originally interred in the Garter Point Cemetery which unfortunately was later destroyed by enemy shell fire, and in consequence all trace of the grave site was obliterated.


Provisional action was taken at the time to suitably perpetuate the memory of your son by the erection of a Memorial Cross, photographs of which were forwarded to you on 12/4/21, but in view of the number of identifications similarly lost sight of in this particular area it has now been decided to erect a Special Collective Memorial Cross in Perth China Wall Cemetery, Zillebeke, upon which will be engraved the names and full regimental particulars of the soldiers concerned, together with the following inscription, viz :-

" To the memory of these 19 soldiers of the British Empire, killed in action 1917-18, and buried at the time in Garter Point Cemetery, which was destroyed by the enemy."

" Their glory shall not be blotted out."
