With reference to the regrettable loss of your son, Lieutenant F. H. Faddy, 13th Battalion, herewith please find copy of a report by Lieutenant Colonel J. M. A. Durrant, O.C. 13th Battalion.

2. Lieut. J. A. McLeod, 13th Battalion. That he was killed in action during the night of 2/3.5.15.
3. Lieut. F.H. Faddy, 13th Battalion. That enquiry should be made at all Base Hospitals, and that, if then no trace can be found of him, the only reasonable assumption will be that he was killed in action 2/3.5.15.
4. Lieut. L.N. Collins, 15th Battalion. That as there is a possibility of his having been taken prisoner on the early morning of 10.5.15., he should continue to be shown as "Missing".
5. Lieut. S. W. Harry, 15th Battalion. That he was killed in action during the early morning of 10.5.15.
6. Lieut. T. Robertson, 15th Battalion. That as there is a possibility that he may have been taken prisoner on 27.4.15 (either wounded or unwounded), he should continue to be shown as "Missing".
7. Lieut. C. A. Geddes, 16th Battalion. That he was killed in action during the night of 2/3.5.15.
8. Lieut. H. A. Southern, 16th Battalion. That he was killed in action during the night of 2/3/5/15.

The night before the charge, early on the morning of the 3rd May, Faddy came up to informant's gun pit, which the Lt. had been using as an observation station, to say good-bye, as he felt he would never come back; he gave the men with the gun his telescope. In the morning Lt. Faddy went up Dead Man's Gully and led the charge across Bald's Ridge in front of Pope's Hill. He never returned.

5th WITNESS

Major Hugh Quinn, states :-

Lieut. Collins was in command of No. 12 Platoon of my Company ("C" Co., 15th Battn). About 11.40 p.m. on 9.5.15, I was called upon by Lieut. Col. Cannan for my Company to support attack on Turkish trenches from Quinn's Post. Lieut. Collins with his Platoon was sent out by Lieut. Col. Cannan to reinforce Lieut. Frank A Armstrong. Neither Lieut. Collins nor any member of his Platoon who accompanied him have since been seen. Lieut. F. A. Armstrong was killed about 6 a.m. the morning after.

In my opinion it is possible that Lieut. Collins has been taken prisoner, and that this is quite as probable as that he was killed.

MAJOR J.M.A.DURRANT, 13th BATTALION, A.I.F. STATED:-

During the action against the Turks on night of 2/3.5.15 about 9.30 p.m on 2.5.15 I was told by Lieut-Colonel Burnage that Lieut Faddy had been shot. About 10 p.m., I was about 50 yds behind our firing line which covered a front of about 250 yds running N.E. in prolongation of the words DEAD MAN'S RIDGE on map Anzac position. Lieut. Faddy came up from the firing line towards me. His head was bound up and I asked him what was the matter. He replied "I am shot in the neck and in the head". I walked for 10 or 15 yds with him, showed him the way down through the Gully by which the 16th Battalion had moved up. This Gully was under intermittent fire. Since then I have not seen Lieut. Faddy, nor have I been able to obtain any information about him, either from Officers or others of the 13th Battalion, A.A.M.C, or any other Unit. Special enquiry has been made at the Hospitals on beach but no record of his having passed their hands has been traced.

No one was with Lieut. Faddy when he left me. He walked with firm step and spoke plainly otherwise I should have sent someone with him. Unless he can be traced in Alexandria or at any other Base Hospital I consider that the only reasonable conclusion is that he was either again shot or died of wounds while he was proceeding down the Gully and that he is dead.

Dear Madam,

With reference to your communication of 6th. September, I have to advise that the Memorial Plaque and Scroll issued in respect of the services of your son, the late Lieutenant F.H. FADDY, 13th. Battalion, also a copy of the King's Message, were duly forwarded to the deceased's Father, Mr. F.H. Faddy, and his acknowledgment of receipt is held at this Office. No duplicates of these mementoes are being issued by the Department.

In reply to your further enquiry I have to inform you with regret that despite the most searching investigation the Imperial War Graves Commission have not been successful in recovering the remains of this Officer and his name has accordingly been inscribed on the Memorial to the Missing erected at Lone Pine, Gallipoli. Advice to this effect was forwarded to Mr. Faddy on 17.2.1926 and the opportunity was afforded you at the time of obtaining a copy of the printed Register containing full particulars of those commemorated in this manner. Unfortunately on account of the large number of names engraved on the Memorial it has not been found practicable to provide for the inclusion of personal inscriptions also.

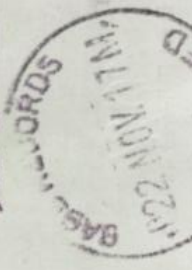

Major James Murdoch Archer Durrant, states:-

During the action against the Turks on night of 2/3.5.15, about 9.30 p.m. on 2.5.15 I was told by Lieut. Col. Burnage that Lieut. Faddy had been shot. About 10 p.m. I was about 50 yards behind our firing line which covered a front of about 250 yards running "N.E." in prolongation of the words "Dead Man's Ridge" on map ANZAC POSITION. Lieut. Faddy came from the firing line towards me. His head was bound up and I asked him what was the matter. He replied "I am shot in the neck and in the head". I walked for 10 or 15 yards with him, showed him the way down through the Gully by which the 16th Battalion had moved up. This Gully was under intermittent fire.

Since then I have not seen Lieut. Faddy, nor have I been able to obtain any information about him, either from officers or others of 13th Battalion, A.A.M.C. or any other unit. Special enquiry has been made at the Hospitals on beach but no record of his having passed their hands has been traced.

No one was with Lieut. Faddy when he left me. He walked with firm step and spoke plainly, otherwise I should have sent someone with him. Unless he can be traced in Alexandria or at any other Base Hospital, I consider that the only reasonable conclusion is that Lieut. Faddy was either again shot or died of wounds while he was proceeding down the Gully, and that he is dead.

Sir,

In continuation of my cablegram MFC. 11483 dated 18th August with reference to your cable B.R.10444 to Superflux, I forward attached herewith an explanatory statement in connection with the history of the case of Lieut. F.H.Faddy, 13th Battalion, A.I.F.

The explanation regarding the error made in reporting Lieut. Faddy as convalescent is unsatisfactory, and was evidently due to carelessness and inexperience on the part of the clerk dealing with this particular unit, and also to want of careful verification on the part of the officer in charge of the Australian Record Subsection. The only excuse that can be urged in the clerk's case is that he was untrained, and in the officer's case that he was at that period overworked and that his experience in work of the description to which he had been detailed by the Australian authorities was limited.

It must be borne in mind that practically the whole of the clerical staff assembled at the commencement of operations to deal with the Record Subsection of the Australian Forces had no previous experience in work of this description. Every endeavour by means of understudy was made to teach them their duties; free access being given for reference to qualified and experienced orderly-room clerks of the Regular Forces with the 29th Division. Before, however, the full advantage could be taken of such understudy, reports of casualties poured in for the 29th Division, and the instructing clerks had their hands completely full in dealing with their own work.

The Australian Subsection has been considerably handicapped by want of experience. All have tried to do their best and with the experience gained during the past 5 months matters are improving.

I propose to deal in another letter more in detail with the difficulties attending the situation and the failures that were due to the fact that practically the improvised staff of the Australian Subsection had to deal with an unexpectedly heavy amount of work in connection with casualties at very short and sudden notice.
