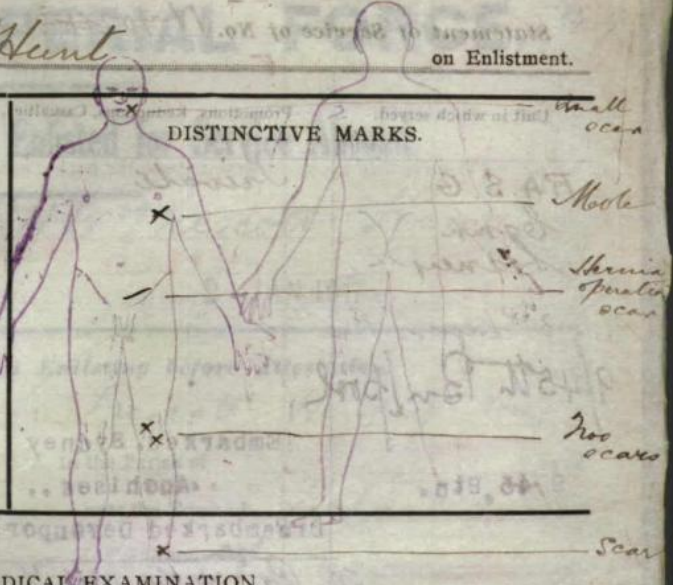

I am advised by the overseas authorities that during recent exhumation work the grave of an unknown Australian soldier was discovered about 4 mile due North of Broodseinde, Belgium, whose remains were buried in a portion of a ground sheet upon which the following names were inscribed :-

W. KLOSTER
P. H. HUNT.

It is thought the former name may refer to you, and I should be glad if you would inform me whether you recollect having a ground sheet so marked, or can you offer any suggestion which would assist in establishing the identity of the soldier in question.

It is assumed the latter name refers to the late No. 3384 Pte. P. H. Hunt, 45th Btn, who died on wounds on 19/6/18 and is buried in the Grouy British Cemetery.

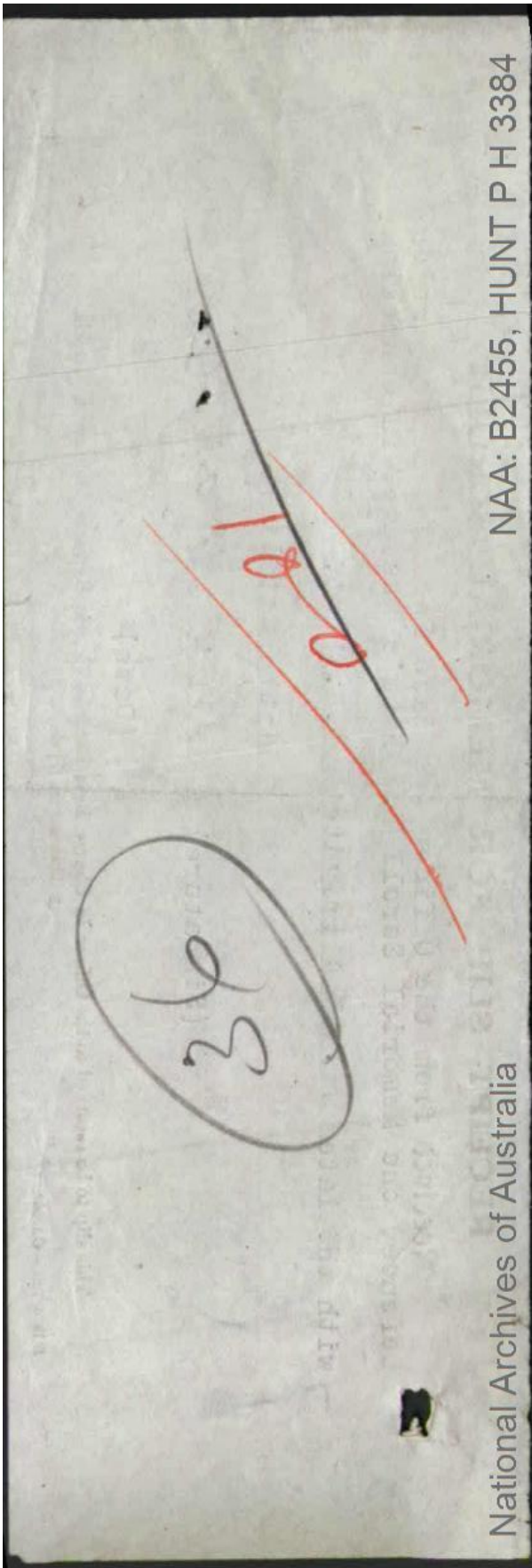

Dear Madam,

I have to acknowledge receipt of your letter dated 26th May in connection with the affairs of your son, the late No. 3384, Private P. H. Hunt, 45th Battalion, and to state my communication of the 20th May referred to the disposal of deceased's War Medals, etc., and I shall be much obliged if you will favor me with a definite statement as to whether his father is living and if so his present address.






