7 Post-Anzac Day activities		

1 Purpose

This sub-Branch Standard Operating Procedure (SOP) provides guidance on the planning and conduct of the sub-Branch's annual Anzac Day Dawn Service, to ensure that it is conducted with dignity and in accordance with accepted protocols. The details of this SOP were sourced originally from paper files made mostly by the former Hon. Secretary, the late Joe Davidson and complied by the former President, RADM Bruce Kafer (Rtd).

2 Background

The ANZAC Day Dawn Service and the Illawarra Anzac Day March are the two major activities planned to be conducted by the sub-Branch as part of its Anzac Day commemorative responsibilities. The other activities that may be conducted subject to health and risk considerations are: the Wollongong Town Hall Service, and the 'Anzac Day in Schools' program. All four activities are described in separate SOPs.

3 Overview

The sub-Branch's ANZAC Day Dawn Service is normally held outdoors at the Wollongong Cenotaph (84 Church St, Wollongong) on the NE edge of MacCabe Park, Wollongong, commencing at 0550 hrs. However, if the weather is forecast to be unsuitable (lightening/thunder etc) or if NSW Health Orders or other issues necessitate an indoor service, a fall-back option is to hold the service in the main auditorium of the City Diggers Club, Church Street, Wollongong. This SOP will provide planning guidance for both outdoors and indoors services.

Members of the public are normally welcome to attend the Dawn Service, and in recent years the estimated number of attendees has exceeded 1,000. Advice regarding the service is issued via a media release, interviews with members of the sub-Branch executive, and invitations issued to VIP guests and other specific participants.

4 COVID Considerations

With future COVID lockdown restrictions a possibility, it is recommended that a risk assessment be conducted to determine if/how a service can be held - before commencing the planning sequence. The main considerations are: existing NSW Public Health Orders on the numbers of people in an approved gathering; any requirement to vet attendees as having one or more COVID vaccinations and how that may be practical given other considerations; and if the City Diggers Club is able to host an indoors service. 5 Planning Sequence

5.1 By 14 January:

Commence liaison with the Wollongong City Council (WCC) Events Team. Support will be required if the service is held at the Cenotaph. It is recommended that meetings be held at least 3-weekly with WCC staff until the end of March, and then at least weekly in April in the lead-up to Anzac Day. WCC staff maintain and regularly update a comprehensive 'Event Manual' that provides guidance on the roles of various participants (RSL, WCC, NSW Police, Traffic Management Services etc) in planning and executing all Anzac Day activities. The sub-Branch planners are to assist WCC staff in updating this document, particularly for tasks that the RSL has responsibility for.

Inform the NSW Police of the Dawn Service, in addition to other ANZAC Day events. Advise them that this activity, if held at the Cenotaph, will require road closures. Complete their form 'Notice of Intention to hold a Public Assembly' and forward to Wollongong Traffic Police. Annex A contains a template of the 'Notice of Intention'. Other risk-related documents may need to be provided (Liability Insurance Certificates, Crowded Place Assessment, and a Risk self-assessment).

Inform Wollongong Golf Club (WGC) Events person of ANZAC Day events, including the Dawn Service, and Gunfire Breakfast. Commence liaison on post-service and post-March catering/hospitality requirements, and make a tentative booking for the main auditorium as a backup venue for an outdoor service. Arrange to conduct regular meetings with WGC Events staff in the lead-up to ANZAC Day.

5.2 By the end of February:

Prepare and issue invitation letters to guests, with RSVP by 5 April. See Annex B for an example of an invitation letter. A proposed invitation list is attached at Attachment 2, and is correct for individuals as of February 2022.

Note: Several VIP guests are also to be invited to attend the Town Hall service, so their invitation letters should also request their participation in that event. Those guests who are invited to both services are highlighted in the invitation list (Attachment 2)

Contact bugler and vocalist to seek musical and vocal support, and follow-up this contact with letters. Mr Frank Leonard ('Paul and Frank' duo) has provided vocal support for many years, and can also provide recorded music for hymns and national anthems. The bugler has been Ken Milner

for several years; he is a member of the Wollongong Brass Band. The sub-Branch was supported by Mr Neil Wright for the 2021 ANZAC Day Dawn Service because Ken was unavailable. The Band does not normally support our Dawn Service as they are normally at the Port Kembla Dawn Service. Frank Leonard can provide a recording on CD of all musical support (hymns & anthems) for use at the Dawn Service in consultation with IPS.

The Bugler may be offered a donation to offset his costs. The Paul & Frank Duo are historically renumerated \$200 per attendance on production of an 'invoice'.

Invite an ADF member to deliver the Commemorative address - whoever delivers the address also lays the wreath on behalf of the ADF. Normally a senior officer is invited to undertake this task at the Dawn Service, but a Senior non-Commissioned Officer might be equally appropriate. *This element is normally coordinated without liaison with JOSS (i.e. via an invitation/request sent directly to the ADF member from the sub-Branch President), however it can be added to the annual application to JOSS for coordination of overall ADF support. The only advantage of submitting this request to JOSS is the reach, leverage and authority it has with ADF units to obtain a guest speaker, rather than risking negative responses if requests are sent directly from the sub-Branch to ADF members.*

Arrange first-aid support for the outdoor service from St John Ambulance. The application for support is submitted via the St John NSW website (<u>www.stjohnnsw.com.au</u>); click on 'Event Health Services' tab and compile the Event Booking online. St John Ambulance should respond to the online request within 14 days; if a response is not received by mid-October contact the POC: <u>St</u> John Ambulance: Wollongong Division Commander - Mr Nick Kafer (0431 718 936).

Commence liaison with Illawarra Taxi Network regarding free transport for sub-Branch members from their home locations into Wollongong CBD for the Dawn Service. The taxi company normally provides up to 20 taxis gratis, for use by members. <u>Note</u>: The Taxi Network does not provide free transport for members to their home locations after the Dawn Service or March.

5.3 By 10 March:

Contact vocalist and bugler - if they haven't contacted you by then - to check their availability to support the service.

Contact JOSS to obtain confirmation of 'booking' of B Company Catafalque Party for the Dawn Service, plus other requested support for the March.

If/when JOSS approves ADF support, contact the WO Training at B Company to confirm the availability of a Catafalque Party to support the Dawn Service, and obtain advice from him on if/when the Guard Commander will wish to undertake a rehearsal (the request for support from B Company should have also been sent to the OC in his invitation letter).

Call Flower Bud florist to forewarn staff that the sub-Branch will place an order for wreaths and Rosemary sprigs about a week before the Dawn Service. The sub-Branch only pays for wreaths for: the sub-Branch, ADF representative, the sub-Branch, and Australian War Widows. However, we also normally order wreaths for Federal and State MPs, the Lord Mayor and the local Police Commander (if they attend), and they are invoiced directly and separately by the florist. Other guests who are invited to lay wreaths are expected to bring their own, and this should be highlighted in the invitation letters. See Annex D for example of an email confirming the wreath order.

<u>Note</u>: this order should also include a sub-Branch wreath for the Figtree Sports Club service, to be held at the Sports Club later on ANZAC Day. This wreath can be delivered to either the City Diggers Club or Figtree Sports Club - whichever option is most convenient.

Contact Go-Hire and order the hire of 250 plastic chairs - to be delivered to the Cenotaph **no later than 0430 hrs** on 25 April, and to be collected immediately after the service (at approximately 0600 hrs. A Committee member should remain with the chairs after the service until their collection - to avoid theft. Indicative cost for hire, delivery/pickup/labour was \$1,122 – 2022.

Contact Illawarra Production Services to organise audio support for an outdoor service at the Cenotaph. This will include microphones and PA loud speakers (including microphones for Master of Ceremonies and vocalists, and several loud speakers spread across the eastern side of MacCabe Park).

The sub-Branch might also consider hiring audio-visual equipment, camera operator and producer to televise the Dawn Service in Church and Burelli Streets to those members of the public who are unable to see the service due to the size of the crowd.

5.4 By 25 March:

Contact printers (SNAP Printing) to place orders for Orders of Service for the Dawn Service and the Town Hall Service - 300 copies for the Dawn Service and 300 copies for the Town Hall Service. Advise SNAP staff that draft versions will be forwarded approx. one (1) week before Anzac Day, for formatting and production. See Annex C for a draft version of the Order of Service for the Dawn Service. Approximate cost for 300 copies - \$592.90 for 2022.

Seek a volunteer to be MC for the Dawn Service, and provide guidance to them on their duties for the day.

Liaise with Figtree Sports Club to secure loan of the club's bus for Anzac Day. Arrange drivers for RSL and Figtree Sports buses, and ensure they are aware of the sub-Branch's transport requirements for Anzac Day.

5.5 By 7 April:

Obtain bids from sub-Branch members for free taxi transport from their home locations to Wollongong CBD for the Dawn Service.

Develop VIP Seating Plan and list of wreath layers, based on RSVPs received by 11 April.

5.6 By 11 April:

Deadline for receipt of RSVPs.

5.7 By 17 April

Email an order for Orders of Service, for the Dawn Service and the Town Hall Service to SNAP Printing, and transmit the draft documents for development. SNAP will provide final versions for review prior to printing the documents - which should be ready for collection at least 3 days before ANZAC Day.

Prepare a 'Running Sheet' for the Master of Ceremonies (MC) based on the Order of Service, and forward for his review. A draft version of the MC's Running sheet for the 2022 Dawn Service is attached at Annex E.

Email 'Media Release' to local media outlets (WIN TV, ABC Radio Illawarra, i98 FM, Wave FM and Illawarra Mercury). Annex F to this SOP is a draft Media Release, which advertises the Dawn Service, Wollongong ANZAC Day March and Town Hall Service.

Confirm with the vocalist when he wants to set up his equipment, and whether he needs any support or facilities (e.g. a table).

Check with Training WO at B Company on intentions for Catafalque Party rehearsal (if required).

Confirm with WGC Events staff that sub-Branch Committee members can access The City Diggers Club at 0400 hrs on Anzac Day to obtain equipment/materials for Dawn Service.

Forward details to Illawarra Taxi Network (John Megas) of those members requesting free taxi travel from home to Dawn Service - names, addresses and phone numbers.

5.8 By 20 April:

Email the finalised order for wreaths and Rosemary to florist. The order is to include advice to the florist on what should be written on the card/tape attached to each wreath, and invoicing arrangements (Annex D contains a copy of the 2020 email order for guidance). Request that the wreaths are delivered to City Diggers Club by 1600 hrs on 24 April, and liaise with club staff to receive them.

5.9 By 22 April:

Ensure copies of the Orders of Service (Dawn and Town Hall Services) are collected and stored in the sub-Branch office in City Diggers Club.

5.10 By On 24 April:

<u>If the City Diggers auditorium (Owen Room) is to be used for service</u>: set up venue - flags, table for wreaths, lectern, reserved seating, other seating etc. Check sound system with club staff, including access to separate microphones for MC and vocalist.

Ensure wreaths are delivered to the City Diggers Club by 1600 hrs for overnight storage in cool room. Check all wreaths against Flower Bud order to ensure receipt of correct number, and correct labelling.

Catafalque Party rehearsal - TBC.

6 On ANZAC Day

Sub-Branch Committee to be collected from their homes by bus and transported to The City Diggers Club - to arrive at 0400 hrs. Sub-Branch members using either taxi or RSL buses need to arrive no later than 0445 hrs.

6.1 If the service is held at the Cenotaph:

Obtain keys for flagpoles' locks from sub-Branch office, plus Australian and New Zealand National Flags (the flagpoles near the Cenotaph have covers protecting their halyards, and the covers are secured with small padlocks; the keys for these padlocks are on a key-ring that is hanging on the inside of one of the large cupboard doors in the sub-Branch office). The Australian National Flag (ANF) is to be flown at half mast from sunrise until 1200 hours on ANZAC Day. During individual ANZAC Day ceremonies, the Australian National Flag is to be half mast and then raised to the peak during the playing of 'Reveille' at the conclusion of the service. The ANF is flown on the left as you look at it. The New Zealand flag is flown on the right.

Transfer sub-Branch lectern, wreaths, national flags and Orders of Service from City Diggers Club to MacCabe Park in sub-Branch bus.

Arrange plastic chairs adjacent to the Cenotaph. Approximately 30 chairs should be positioned for VIP guests on the southern edge of the Cenotaph area, and the remaining chairs are to be located on the north side. Name plaques should be placed on VIP guests' chairs to reserve those seats, and wreaths that the sub-Branch has purchased should be placed under the appropriate seats.

Committee members to distribute Orders of Service to VIP guests and other people attending the service.

Confirm presence of St John Ambulance personnel.

Check sound system set-up - particularly microphones for MC (at lectern) and vocalists.

Ensure Diggers Club staff are preparing required catering for Gunfire Breakfast.

<u>Note</u>: Flag ceremonial procedures for the Remembrance Day service are to be in accordance with RSL NSW Commemorative Protocols.

7 Post-Anzac Day activities

Upon receipt of invoices pay organisations that provided support: Wollongong Golf Club, bugler, vocalists, florists, printers, hire company, audio support company etc.

Conduct internal 'wash-up' and a separate debrief with relevant organisations: Wollongong City Council, NSW Police, and Wollongong Golf Club etc. Assist WCC staff in updating their 'ANZAC Day Event Manual' with lessons learnt from the three sub-Branch activities held on the day.

NOTICE OF INTENTION TO HOLD A PUBLIC ASSEMBLY Summary Offences Act 1988

To the Commissioner of Police

1. I John Sperring President of the City of Wollongong RSL sub-Branch PO Box 266 FIGTREE NSW 2525 on behalf of the City of Wollongong and the Wollongong City Council notify the Commissioner of Police that on the 25th day of April 2022 it is intended to hold the Wollongong City ANZAC Day March:

(a) a public assembly, and a procession, of approximately 1,000 persons which will assemble at Kembla Street, and the Wollongong City Mall at approximate 0920 am, proceed along Burelli Street into Church Street and disperse in MacCabe Park at approximately 1040 am.

2. The purpose of the proposed assembly is to stage the Wollongong City ANZAC Day March.

3. The following special characteristics associated with the assembly would be useful for the Commissioner of Police to be aware of in regulating the flow of traffic or in regulating the assembly:

(i) There will be 15-20 vehicles assembled in Kembla Street (between Market and Crown Streets) carrying mostly disabled veterans.

(ii) There will be approx.10 bands interspersed in the march.

4. I take responsibility for organising and conducting the proposed public assembly on behalf of the City and the Council.

Hi Krista,

I wish to place an order with Flower Bud for wreaths for this RSL sub-Branch 's ANZAC Day activities. I ask that 8 x 40 cm wreaths, all with 'LEST WE FORGET' ribbons, be prepared. I request that one wreath – as indicated below – be delivered to the Figtree Sports Club (The Avenue, Figtree) during the afternoon/early evening of Friday 23 April, and the remaining 7 be delivered to the City Diggers Club on Saturday 24 April. The staffs of both clubs are aware that wreaths will be delivered on those days.
