1 Purpose

This sub-Branch Standard Operating Procedure (SOP) provides guidance on the planning and conduct of the Wollongong City ANZAC Day March, to ensure that it is conducted in accordance with accepted RSL NSW protocols. The details of this SOP were sourced originally from paper files made mostly by the former Hon. Secretary, the late Joe Davidson and complied by the former President, RADM Bruce Kafer (Rtd).

2 Background

The Wollongong City ANZAC Day March and the ANZAC Day Dawn Service are the two major activities planned to be conducted by the sub-Branch as part of its ANZAC Day commemorative responsibilities. The other activities that may be conducted subject to health and risk considerations are: the Wollongong Town Hall Service, and the 'ANZAC Day in Schools' program. All four activities are described in separate SOPs.

3 Overview

The City of Wollongong RSL sub-Branch plans and conducts the Wollongong City ANZAC Day March. Wollongong City Council (WCC) has designated the sub-Branch as the 'Event Organiser' for this significant annual public event. The Chief Marshal (a sub-Branch official) has overall responsibility for this activity.

The march contains approximately 25 marching contingents plus several vintage vehicles, with police escorts at the front and rear of the parade. There are approximately 1,000 participants in the march, which starts in the lower section (eastern end) of the Crown Street Mall where contingents form up in March order. The vintage vehicles rally in Simpson Place and lead off the march at 1000 hrs, turning right into Kembla Street with the marching contingents following. The march then turns right into Burelli Street and then left into Church Street; after passing the cenotaph the contingents march into MacCabe Park where they disperse. The march's length is approximately 1 km, so each contingent normally takes 15-20 minutes to traverse the route.

Members of the public are normally encouraged to spectate along the march's route, and in past years several thousand spectators have lined the March route to support the participants - particularly if the weather is favourable. Public information regarding the march is issued via a media release, plus interviews with members of the sub-Branch executive, and articles in local print and social media.

4 COVID Considerations

With future COVID lockdown restrictions a possibility, it is recommended that a risk assessment be conducted to determine if/how a march can be held - before commencing the planning sequence. The main considerations are: existing NSW Public Health Orders on the numbers of people in an approved gathering; separation of marching contingents and individual participants; and management of spectators. Planning Sequence

4.1 By 14 January:

Commence liaison with the Wollongong City Council (WCC) Events Team. Specific liaison on the march should be led and coordinated by the sub-Branch's designated Chief Marshal, with the support of the Commemorative Events planning team. It is recommended that meetings be held at least 3-weekly with WCC staff and other appropriate stakeholders until the end of March, and then at least weekly in April in the lead-up to Anzac Day.

WCC staff maintain and regularly update a comprehensive 'Event Manual' that provides guidance on the roles of various participants (RSL, WCC, NSW Police, Traffic Management Services etc) in planning and executing all Anzac Day activities. The sub-Branch planners are to assist WCC staff in updating this document, particularly for tasks that the RSL has responsibility for.

Inform the NSW Police Force of the Wollongong City ANZAC Day March, in addition to other Anzac Day events. Complete their form 'Notice of Intention to hold a Public Assembly' and forward to Wollongong Traffic Police. Annex A contains a template of the 'Notice of Intention'. Other risk-related documents may need to be provided (Liability Insurance Certificates, Crowded Place Assessment, and a Risk self-assessment).

4.2 By 14 February:

Chief Marshal to prepare and forward letters containing the following invitations:

- To an ADF member to be the 'March Leader' whoever is asked to undertake this task is also asked to deliver the Commemorative Address at the Town Hall service (if held).
- To a senior ADF officer (either retired or serving) to be the march's Reviewing Officer. He/she should be accompanied by Wollongong's Lord Mayor on the reviewing dais, which is positioned on Burelli Street adjacent to the Woolworths supermarket.

Chief Marshal to contact three local bands and TS *Albatross* to seek advice on their availability to provide musical support for the march. <u>Note</u>: the three bands receive remuneration from the sub-Branch for their support, and they should invoice the sub-Branch after ANZAC Day. TS *Albatross* provides a small Drum Corps.

<u>Note</u>: the sub-Branch remunerates HARS for its support for the march. An invoice is forwarded by HARS after Anzac Day. Additionally, from 2022 the sub-Branch includes HARS in its budgeted donations.

Contact the supplier of the hand-held radios and arrange a suitable pick-up time (Chief Marshal).

4.3 By end of February:

Contact JOSS to obtain confirmation of ADF contingents participating in the March (those requested in 'ADF Request for Ceremonial Support' are submitted in September/October in previous year). For 2022 JOSS has approved ADF support to the march (CRN 017/22 of 04 September 2021).

After receiving advice from JOSS liaise directly with senior staff of B Company 4th/3rd Battalion and the Australian Hydrographic Office to obtain POCs for coordination of their representation in the march.

Request first-aid support for the march from St John Ambulance. The application for support is submitted via the St John NSW website (www.stjohnnsw.com.au); click on 'Event Health Services' tab and compile the Event Booking online. St John Ambulance should respond to the online request within 14 days; if a response is not received by mid-October contact the POC: St John Ambulance: Wollongong Division Commander - Mr Nick Kafer (0431 718 936).

Contact NSW Ambulance Service to inform senior staff of the March and to request additional support (ambulance vehicle/s and staff to be positioned in Wollongong CBD to assist St John Ambulance staff if necessary).

Chief Marshal to contact local SES and RFS officials to determine if these services can provide marshals for the march (the marshals are normally dispersed along the March route to ensure spectators do not encroach on road and block marching contingents).

If so, inform club officials that Vintage Car Request Forms will be emailed to local RSL sub-Branches and the National Servicemen's Association Sub-Branch, with a deadline of 14 April for submission to the car club's POC.

4.4 By 15 March:

Chief Marshal to email Vintage Car Request Forms to local RSL sub-Branches and the National Servicemen's Association, for distribution to their members, and highlight the deadline of 15 April for submission of completed forms to the club's coordinator (Mr Donald), whose details are on the form. A copy of the request form is at Annex B.

WCC staff will develop a Traffic Control Plan and brief for the march. They will forward it to the sub-Branch in mid-March for review, comments and any proposed changes.

Request that the WCC car park (cnr Keira and Ellen Streets) is reserved on Anzac Day for parking by coaches and other vehicles from local ex-Service organisations and the Vietnamese Community group.

If requested by WCC Events staff, prepare a letter for submission to WCC requesting 'financial assistance' for the conduct of Anzac Day activities - particularly the march, which requires the largest proportion of resources. WCC provides 'support in kind' to the sub-Branch, so the purpose of this letter is to enable WCC Events staff to obtain funding from the WCC's Financial Assistance Program. A draft version of the letter submitted in 2021 (for assistance in 2021 and 2022) is at Annex C.

4.5 By 7 April:

If required by WCC, develop a COVID-19 Safety Plan and submit it to the WCC and NSW Health for consideration. Obtain advice from local community groups on their participation in the march. The Chief Marshal is to arrange hire of portable radios for sub-Branch marshals.

4.6 By 13 April:

Chief Marshal to complete March Instruction and email document to all organisations participating in the march. An unsigned version of the 2021 March Instruction is at Annex D.

President to email 'Media Release' to local media outlets (WIN TV, ABC Radio Illawarra, i98 FM, Wave FM and Illawarra Mercury). Annex E to this SOP is a draft Media Release, which advertises the Dawn Service, Wollongong Anzac Day March and Town Hall Service.

Chief Marshal to confirm with the South Coast Vintage Car Club (Mr Donald) that requests for vehicles are being processed. Request that he provide a list of drivers, vehicles' makes and registrations, and passengers to WCC Events staff by 20 April (Vera Cvetkoski vcvetkoski@wollongong.nsw.gov.au or Jayne Whitehead@wollongong.nsw.gov.au

Confirm with WCC Events staff that the WCC car park (cnr Keira and Ellen Streets) will be reserved for coaches and other vehicles from ex-Service organisations and the Vietnamese Community group. Subject to this confirmation, inform organisations using coaches or minibuses to transport members to and from the march that the Council car park has been reserved for their vehicles – if they wish to use it. Advise that portable barricades will be placed across its entrance; however it is unlikely that Council staff will be present there at all times, so if it is unmanned the driver may move the barrier aside whilst entering and leaving the parking area.

5.7 By 22 April:

Chief Marshal to liaise with WCC staff on how vintage cars are to gain access to Kembla St, and then inform South Coast Vintage Car Club (Mr Donald).

5.8 On 24 April

Chief Marshal to collect portable radios and store overnight on charge in sub-Branch office in City Diggers Club.

5 On ANZAC Day

Check to ensure that WCC staff have positioned the dais for the Reviewing Officer and Lord Mayor in Burelli Street.

Chief Marshal and Marshals obtain radios from sub-Branch office and proceed to assigned locations (Crown Street Mall, Simpson Place and MacCabe Park) from 0900 hrs onwards. Chief Marshal plus one Marshal supervise and support marching contingents as they form up; one marshal assists in formation of vintage cars in Simpson Place or Kembla Street as applicable; and the marshal in MacCabe Park supervises dispersal of contingents after the march.

Chief Marshal and Marshals return equipment to sub-Branch office after the March.

6 Post-Anzac Day activities

Chief Marshal to return radios. Upon receipt of invoices the sub-Branch Treasurer is to pay organisations that provided support: HARS, bands etc.

President and Chief Marshal to conduct an internal 'wash-up' and a separate debrief with relevant organisations: Wollongong City Council, NSW Police Force, and the Wollongong Golf Club etc. Assist WCC staff in updating their 'ANZAC Day Event Manual' with lessons learnt from the sub-Branch ANZAC Day activities held on the day.

On 01 September contact JOSS to obtain approval of ADF support for commemorative activities for the following year. Form 'ADF Request for Ceremonial Support' are required to be submitted in September/October in previous year.

NOTICE OF INTENTION TO HOLD A PUBLIC ASSEMBLY Summary Offences Act 1988

To the Commissioner of Police

- **1** I John Sperring President of the City of Wollongong RSL sub-Branch PO Box 266 FIGTREE NSW 2525 on behalf of the City of Wollongong and the Wollongong City Council notify the Commissioner of Police that on the 25th day of April 2022 it is intended to hold the Wollongong City ANZAC Day March:
- (a) a public assembly, and a procession, of approximately 1,000 persons which will assemble at Kembla Street, and the Wollongong City Mall at approximate 0920 am, proceed along Burelli Street into Church Street and disperse in MacCabe Park at approximately 1040 am.
- **2** The purpose of the proposed assembly is to stage the Wollongong City ANZAC Day March.
- **3** The following special characteristics associated with the assembly would be useful for the Commissioner of Police to be aware of in regulating the flow of traffic or in regulating the assembly:
- (i) There will be 15-20 vehicles assembled in Kembla Street (between Market and Crown Streets) carrying mostly disabled veterans.
- (ii) There will be approx.10 bands interspersed in the march.
- **4** I take responsibility for organising and conducting the proposed public assembly on behalf of the City and the Council.

2022 WOLLONGONG ANZAC DAY MARCH

MARCH INSTRUCTION (INCLUDING ORDER OF MARCH)

EVENT

The City of Wollongong RSL sub-Branch is planning and executing the Wollongong ANZAC Day March, to be held on Sunday 25 April 2021. Participating contingents will include local RSL sub-Branches, other ex-Service organisations, ADF personnel, Defence Cadets, community groups and bands.

The City of Wollongong RSL sub-Branch is the designated Event Organiser for the March. It will be supported by the Wollongong City Council, NSW Police Force, NSW Ambulance, St John Ambulance and other volunteer organisations in conducting this event.

Rear Admiral Bruce Kafer AM CSC RAN (Rtd) will be the Reviewing Officer for the March and accompanied on the saluting dais by the Lord Mayor of the City of Wollongong Gordon Bradbery AM.

EXECUTION

The March will commence at 10:00 AM.

All participants are to be in position by 9:40 AM.

The marshalling area is in the Crown Street Mall, facing Kembla Street.

Commodore Stewart Dunne, RAN (the Hydrographer of Australia) will lead the March.

The March route is approximately 800 metres in length. It commences in the Crown Street Mall (or Kembla Street for vehicles); contingents then right wheel into Kembla Street, right wheel into Burelli Street, left wheel into Church Street, pass the Cenotaph, then right wheel into MacCabe Park for dispersal.

Vehicles

Vintage cars, minibuses, electric carts/scooters and their passengers will lead the March. They are to form up in Kembla Street (between Market & Crown Streets), and are to be in position by 9:40 AM.

The distance between each vintage vehicle and minibus is to be not less than 5 metres, and they are to travel in single file.

Electric carts/scooters are to travel at the rear of the vintage vehicles, and they are to travel 2 abreast where possible.

The NSW Police Force escort will determine the speed at which vehicles travel.

Vehicle drivers are not to sound their horns unless they are signalling an immediate emergency.

FORMATIONS

Column 1 – assemble in Kembla Street

Police Escort

Vintage vehicles and minibuses

Electric carts/scooters

Column 2 – assemble in Crown Street Mall, facing Kembla Street

26 contingents will participate in the March; therefore 26 numbered cones will be positioned on the northern (left) side of the Mall, with Number 1 being closest to Kembla Street and the remainder spaced out along the Mall in numerical order.

Each contingent is to form up alongside the cone having the number that the contingent has been allocated in the Order of March.

MARKS OF RESPECT / SALUTES

The Reviewing Officer, accompanied by the Lord Mayor of Wollongong, will formally review the March from a raised position adjacent to the Woolworths supermarket in Burelli Street.

Contingent commanders/leaders should pay their respects to the Reviewing Officer as they pass – by acknowledging him or saluting, and directing their contingent to 'Eyes Left' (where appropriate).

Contingent commanders/leaders should also salute or acknowledge the Cenotaph in Church Street as the pass, and direct their contingent to 'Eyes Right' (where appropriate).

DISPERSAL

Vehicles are to enter the car park in MacCabe Park (adjacent to Pioneer Hall) from Church Street, and park in marked spaces. They are to remain stationary in those parking spaces until all marching contingents have passed and dispersed.

Contingents are to 'right wheel' from Church Street into the same car park, as directed by a Marshal. They are to continue marching through the car park and onto the grassed area of MacCabe Park, and continue until they are well into the park area before halting and dispersing.

Contingent leaders are to ensure that their members do not linger or congregate in this area – they are to disperse as soon as possible to ensure COVID-19 social distancing requirements are met.

SECURITY / ADMINISTRATION

Barriers will be erected at various intersections along the March route, for the security of participants and spectators. Wollongong City Council is responsible for erecting these barriers in accordance with an approved Traffic Management Plan, and completing other preparatory security measures prior to the March.

All designated marshals and volunteers are to carry portable radios and wear reflective vests. Emergency services members will wear their respective uniforms. COVID Safety Marshals will wear identifying badges.

This Instruction is to be distributed to every group/organisation supporting and participating in the 2022 Wollongong ANZAC Day March.

HEALTH AND SAFETY

COVID-19 Safety Measures

A COVID-19 Safety Plan has been prepared for the March, and the City of Wollongong RSL sub-Branch has registered as a COVID Safe organisation. A QR Code has been designated for this activity, to enable registration by spectators. COVID Marshals will be posted amongst the spectators to ensure they comply with current public health requirements.

Recording of participants' details. This year every contingent must have a nominated 'organiser', who is to ensure that a list is produced of every participant in their group (including people who might join at the last minute), plus telephone numbers and/or email addresses of each participant. Every contingent's organiser is to email their list to Darren Wheeler (WollongongSB@rslnsw.org.au) by 8:00 PM on 25 April to ensure that a record of every marcher is available for contact tracing if required.

Wellbeing of Participants. Contingent leaders are to ensure that members who are unwell are excluded from taking part in the March. Physical distancing of at least 1.5 metres between each participant is to be enforced - contingents are to form up and march 4-abreast to aid this requirement. Contingent Commanders/Leaders are to ensure that their groups disperse quickly after completing the March – participants are not to linger and congregate in large groups in MacCabe Park.

FIRST AID / AMBULANCE SUPPORT

St John Ambulance will establish three static aid posts along the March route (with two responders at each post). A mobile team will also move along the March route.

The NSW Ambulance Service will also provide an ambulance, to be stationed adjacent to the March route.

Emergency requests for ambulance assistance are to be made on the Triple 0 emergency network,

If there is a requirement for first aid or ambulance assistance anywhere along the March route this is to be given immediate priority over all other activity – even if the March needs to be halted temporarily until the medical crisis has been resolved and the route cleared.

COMMAND AND CONTROL

The Chief Marshal is responsible for overall control of the March. He is the senior representative of the Event Organiser, the City of Wollongong RSL sub-Branch, and acts with the full authority of the event organiser. In performing his duties, the Chief Marshal is to be supported by other Marshals, plus representatives of Wollongong City Council and NSW Emergency Services.

MEDIA RELEASE 2022 ANZAC DAY EVENTS

ANZAC Day is one of Australia's most important national commemorative occasions. It marks the anniversary of the start of the first major military campaign fought by Australian and New Zealand forces during the First World War.
