Victory in the Pacific Day

1 Purpose

This sub-Branch Standard Operating Procedure (SOP) provides guidance on the planning and conduct of the sub-Branch's annual Victory in the Pacific (VP) Day commemorative service, to ensure that it is conducted with dignity and in accordance with accepted protocols. The details was sourced from paper files made mostly by the former Hon. Secretary, the late Joe Davidson and complied by the former President, RADM Bruce Kafer (Rtd).

2 Background

VP Day services are held on 15 August each year. On the morning of 15 August 1945, the Emperor of Japan announced that his country would accept the Allies' ultimatum to surrender. For Australians, this signified the end of the World War II. A war that had seen nearly one million Australians serve in the armed forces. Of those, over 30,000 were taken prisoner and 39,000 did not return to their loved ones.

The commemorative service normally will commence at approximately 1100 hrs on VP Day, because that was the time that the Armistice was signed.

3 Overview

The sub-Branch's VP Day service is normally held outdoors at the Cenotaph in McCabe Park, Wollongong. However, if the weather, NSW Health Orders, and/ or other issues necessitate an indoor service, a fall-back option is to hold the service in the main auditorium (Owen Room) of the City Diggers Club, Church Street, Wollongong. This SOP will provide planning guidance for both outdoors and indoors services.

4 Planning Sequence

(Individual Points of Contact, as at June 2022, are listed in Attachment 1)

4.1 By mid-June:

Inform the Wollongong Golf Club (WGC) of the VP Day event. Commence liaison on any post-service catering/hospitality requirements, and make a tentative booking for the main auditorium as a back-up venue for an outdoor service (subject to availability of auditorium).

Commence liaison with the Wollongong City Council (WCC) Events Team. Support will only be required if the service is held at the Cenotaph. Jayne Whitehead@wollongong.nsw.gov.au

Inform the NSW Police of the VP Day service. Advise them that the event, if held at the Cenotaph, will not require road closures. Complete their form 'Notice of intention to hold a Public Assembly', a 'Crowded Places Security Audit', and a 'Covid Safety Plan (if required),

4.2 By end of June:

Prepare and issue invitation letters to guests, with an RSVP of 15 July 2022. A proposed invitation list is at Annex C, and is correct for individuals as of May 2022. Digital copies of all invitations issued for the VP Day service are filed in the sub-Branch digital archives; these can be used for guidance in preparing invitations.

Contact Mr Mervyn Roulstone, a local Scottish bag-piper, to ascertain his availability to pipe a lament during the wreath laying ceremony.

Contact Illawarra Production Services to seek *mp3*-based musical support. Contact the bugler. Conduct Paul Dunstan and Mr Frank Leonard ('Paul and Frank' duo) for the provision of choral support. The bugler has been Ken Milner for several years; he is a member of the Brass Band.

Invite an ADF member to deliver the Commemorative address - whoever delivers the address also lays the wreath on behalf of the ADF. Suggestions include: senior Navy officers at the Australian Hydrographic Office; the OC of B Company 4/3 Bn; the Senior Military Recruiting Officer in Wollongong or locally available retired officers. For 2022 the person giving the address is Professor Michael Hough AM, RFD ED (a retired Armoured Corps LTCOL with Vietnam War service).

Arrange first-aid support for outdoor service from St John Ambulance. Application for support is submitted via St John NSW website (www.stjohnnsw.com.au); click on 'Event Health Services' tab and compile Event Booking online. St John Ambulance should respond to request within 14 days; if a response is not received by mid-July contact the POC: St John Ambulance: Wollongong Division Commander - Mr Nick Kafer (0431 718 936).

4.3 By 7 July:

Contact vocalist POC - if they haven't contacted you by then - to check their

availability to support the service. It will be necessary to request bugler support separately (Ken Milner or Neil Wright) and ask the vocalist if he is able to provide recorded music for the hymns and anthem.

Contact JOSS to obtain confirmation of 'booking' of B Company Catafalque Party.

When JOSS approves ADF support, contact the WO Training at B Company to confirm the availability of a Catafalque Party to support the service, and obtain advice from him on if/when the Guard Commander will wish to undertake a rehearsal (the request for support from B Company should have also been sent to the OC in his invitation letter).

JOSS approval for the 2022 VP Day ceremony: CRN 20220511 – 162 of 11 May 2022.

Contact Go-Hire to place an order for hire of <u>100</u> plastic chairs - to be delivered to the Cenotaph by 9:30 am on 15 August, and to be collected immediately after the service (at approximately 1145 hrs). <u>Go-Hire</u>: <u>Party2@gohire.com.au</u>. Tel: 4272 9911

4.4 By 14 July:

Contact SNAP Printing & Design to advise that a draft Order of Service will be forwarded at least 2 weeks prior to VP Day, for formatting and production. See Annex C for a draft version. SNAP - Mr James Baker (james@gong.snap.com.au).

Confirm that Mr Peter Lipscomb will do the Master of Ceremonies for the VP Day service, and provide a written brief on the programme for the day.

4.5 By 22 July:

Call Flower Bud florist to forewarn staff that the sub-Branch will place an order for wreaths about a week before the VP Day service. The sub-Branch only pays for wreaths for: ADF representative, the sub-Branch, and Australian War Widows. However, we order wreaths for Federal and State MPs, the Lord Mayor and the local Police Commander (if they attend), and they are invoiced directly and separately by the florist. Other guests who are invited to lay wreaths are expected to bring their own, and this should be highlighted in the invitation letters. An example of an wreath order email is attached at Annex D.

Sub-Branch Commemorations Planning team meet relevant WGC staff and WCC Events staff to discuss the status of preparations. This meeting should also be used to develop a contingency plan for an indoor service: the floor plan and setup for the service, and the order of events (including catering etc). This will give them ample time to complete an event brief, have necessary facilities in place, and ensure their staff are prepared.

4.6 By 1 August:

Email draft Order of Service to printers for development. Printers should provide a final version for review prior to printing the document - which should be ready for collection at least 3 days before VP Day. A copy of the draft Order of Service is attached to this SOP.

Prepare a 'Running Sheet' for the MC, based on the Order of Service, and forward to them for their review. A copy of the MC's Running sheet for the VP Day service is attached for guidance.

Email 'Media Release' to local media outlets (WIN TV, ABC Radio Illawarra, i98 FM, Wave FM and Illawarra Mercury). Annex F to this SOP is a draft Media Release, based on the 2020 VP Day activity.

Contact Mr David Eskine WCC Gardens for a clean-up of the cenotaph.

4.7 By 4 August:

Confirm with vocalist when he wants to set up his equipment, and whether he needs any support or facilities (e.g. a table). Confirm that the 'canned' mp3 music files for the hymns and the national anthem are recorded and have been rehearsed with IPS.

4.8 By 6 August

Email the finalised order for wreaths to florist. The order is to include advice to the florist on what should be written on the card/tape attached to each wreath, and invoicing arrangements (Annex D contains a copy of the 2020 email order for guidance). Request that the wreaths are delivered to the City Diggers Club by 0930 hrs on 15 August, and liaise with club staff to receive them.

4.9 By 8 August:

Ensure copies of the Order of Service are collected and stored in the sub-Branch office. A copy of the printed 2020 VP Day Order of Service is attached.

Ensure laminated seating reserved signs are complete.

4.10 On 14 August:

If auditorium is to be used for service in view of inclement weather, and is available on 14 August: set up venue - flags, table for wreaths, lectern, reserved seating, other seating etc. Check sound system with club staff, including access to separate microphones for MC and vocalist. If the auditorium is unavailable on this date it is possible to set up the venue prior to the service on 15 August, in which case it is recommended that the set-up commence at 0930 hrs.

4.11 On VP Day

Ensure wreaths have been delivered to the City Diggers Club.

Catafalque Party rehearsal - TBC. Check with Training WO at B Company on intentions for rehearsal.

Committee members to arrive 90 minutes before service for setup and meet/greet etc.

If service is held at Cenotaph:

Obtain keys for flagpoles' locks from sub-Branch office, plus Australian National Flag (the flagpoles near the Cenotaph have covers protecting their halyards, and the covers are secured with small padlocks; the keys for these padlocks are on a key-ring that is hanging on the inside of one of the large cupboard doors in the sub-Branch office).

By 0830 Hrs - Hoist the Australian National Flag to half-mast.

Transfer the sub-Branch lectern, wreaths, any poppies, Australian National Flag and Orders of Service copies from the City Diggers Club to the Wollongong Cenotaph.

Arrange plastic chairs adjacent to the Cenotaph. Approximately 30 chairs should be positioned for VIP guests on the western side of the Cenotaph, and the remaining chairs are to be located on the north and south sides. Laminated Reserved Name signs should be placed on VIP guests' chairs to reserve those seats, and the wreaths placed alongside the chair..



Committee members to distribute Orders of Service to VIP guests and other people attending the service.

Confirm presence of St John Ambulance personnel. Check sound system set-up - particularly microphones for MC (at lectern) and vocalists.

Ensure the City Diggers Club staff are prepared for any catering (if required).

<u>Note</u>: Flag ceremonial procedures for the VP Day service are to be in accordance with RSL NSW Commemorative Protocols.

- lowered to half-mast before the start of the service
- raised slowly to the masthead during the playing of The Rouse.

4.12 Post-VP Day activities

Upon receipt of invoices pay organisations that provided support: Wollongong Golf Club, band/bugler, vocalists, florists, hire company, audio support company etc.

Conduct internal 'wash-up' and a separate debrief with relevant organisations: Wollongong City Council, NSW Police, and Wollongong Golf Club etc.

- 1 I, John Stanley Sperring of PO Box 266, FIGTREE NSW 2525 on behalf of the City of Wollongong RSL sub-Branch, notify the Commissioner of Police that on 15 August 2022 it is intended to hold:
- (a) a public assembly, not being a procession, of approximately 100 persons which will assemble at the Wollongong Cenotaph at approximate 10;50 am and disperse at approximately 11:15 am.

Victory in the Pacific Day (VP Day), previously called Victory over Japan Day, is commemorated on 15 August each year. The date commemorates Imperial Japan's acceptance of the Allied demand for unconditional surrender on 14 August 1945. For Australians, it meant that the Second World War was finally over.

VP Day is a very important occasion for all Australians. It holds special significance for the generation who endured the Second World War, particularly our veterans and for those whose loved ones never returned.

It signifies the end of a time in our recent history when Australia was vulnerable to Japanese invasion; when freedom as we know it was very seriously threatened. For anyone aged under 25, World War II is a human crisis experienced vicariously, through the eyes and ears of relatives, friends and others who were there.
